Bipereas, injuries are the third leading cause of death in Oklahoma, and are the leading cause of death for Oklahomans between the ages of one and forty-four years; and

Whereas, more than 3,800 Oklahomans die due to injury every year and more than 21,500 Oklahomans are hospitalized due to injury every year; and

Bijereas, injuries account for more premature deaths before age 65 in Oklahoma than heart disease, cancer, diabetes, stroke, and liver disease combined; and

hereas, unintentional falls are the leading cause of injury death in Oklahoma and hospitalize 9,500 Oklahomans per year; and

Bipereas, 869 Oklahomans died by suicide in 2020; and

Whereas, methamphetamine overdose represents 60% of unintentional drug overdose deaths; and

Bhereas, motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of injury death for children aged 5 to 9 years; and

Whereas, 841 Oklahomans died from firearm-related injuries in 2020; and

Bipereas, injuries occur in predictable and preventable patterns and experiencing injury can have a lifelong impact; and

Bireas, individuals, businesses, and communities should work together to prevent injuries and violence through addressing inequities and implementing research-based programs and policies;

Row Therefore, I, Governor J. Kevin Stitt, do hereby proclaim November 18, 2022, as

"Injury Prevention Day"

in the State of Oklahoma.
